EXPLOITATION AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

WHAT IS IT?

Human trafficking includes transporting and hiding people in a house against their will, with the intention of exploiting them. It can be achieved through violence, threats, or tricking them.



Forced labour

You are forced to work in poor conditions without being able to take breaks, or without being paid. You may be threatened or physically assaulted by your employer.



Sexual exploitation

You are forced to do sex work in a house, or to engage in relationships against your will. You may not be allowed to rest, or to refuse certain clients or practices.



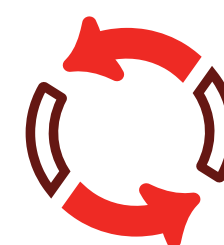
Forced criminal activities

To pay back your debts you are being forced to steal, beg, commits crimes, or transport drugs or weapons for your employer.



Domestic servitude

You clean the house, cook meals and do laundry without being paid. You may not have a proper place to sleep, or be allowed to leave the house on your own.
